Championship Rules & Regulations

1. The AHDA Closed Alberta Provincial Championship is sanctioned and governed by the rules & regulations of the Royal Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing and ScotDance Canada. All dancers must show a current RSOBHD Dancer Registration card to register.
2. **AGE:** Age is to be taken as of July 1 for determining the age classification in which dancers would enter the Canadian Championship. Thus, in preliminary championships or competitions used to select provincial representatives, dancers would compete according to their age on July 1 of that year.
3. **ELIGIBILITY:** For eligibility to compete in the Canadian Championship, a dancer must qualify in a Closed Provincial Championship or Selection Competition. The competitor must qualify by residency first, having been a resident for six (6) months immediately prior to the event. Should a competitor not qualify first by the residency requirement, that competitor may enact the birth qualification in the province they were born. Residency will be determined by the residence of the dancer's legal guardian. If a dancer moves to a new province, that dancer retains residency in the previous province for the purpose of determining eligibility first by residency, until 6 months residency takes place in the new province.

RESIDENCY DEFINITION: Dancers moving to another province and remaining in that province for 6 consecutive months immediately prior to that province's selection meet would qualify by residency to compete in that province's selection meet. If a dancer moves back to the province they previously resided in and remain there immediately prior to that province's selection meet, that dancer would qualify by residency to compete in that province's provincial selection meet, provided they previously resided in that province for 6 consecutive months. In the case of multiple moves, whichever province the dancer had previously resided in for 6 consecutive months prior to moving from that province, would be the province where that dancer would qualify by residency to compete in that province's selection meet.

4. All dancers must dance the 2022 RSOBHD Championship steps. The 7 Years & Under 10 Years class and the 10 Years & Under 12 Years class will dance cut steps as set out by the RSOBHD. Championship steps must be danced regardless of whether or not there are sufficient numbers in the section to qualify as a championship. If a championship class is cancelled due to insufficient entries, all dancers age 12 and over must dance the 2022 RSOBHD Championship steps - no cut steps.
5. Only representatives who are fully paid members of an AHDA local association are eligible for funding.
6. The order to dance will be random draw for Fling, Sword, Seann Triubhas. The order for the Reel will be first to enter, last to dance.
7. Championship events must have a minimum of 6 dancers competing to be eligible for Championship status. Up to 3 dancers may represent Alberta in the Canadian Championship regardless of the number of dancers competing on that day.
8. If neither the Champion and/or runner up is able to attend the Canadian Championship, the next runner(s) up are eligible to attend.

Open Competition Rules & Regulations

1. All dancing events are governed by the rules and regulations of the Royal Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing (RSOBHD) and ScotDance Canada.
2. This event may be cancelled at any time up to, and including on or during the date of competition, dependent upon public health concerns.
3. The decision of the judge(s) is final.

4. With the exception of the competition committee, communication with the judges during the event is strictly prohibited.
5. All competitors must be registered with the RSOBHD or RSOBHD subsidiary body (such as ScotDance Canada) in order to compete. All competitors must present current RSOBHD registration card prior to receiving awards.
6. **Premier competitors who are not registered for the Championship event may enter the Premier Highland events. All premier dancers may enter the Premier National events.**
7. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to ensure the competitor is entered in the correct class and age group. Age is as of 12.01am on competition date - May 8, 2022.
8. Any change in category must be communicated to Kim Spence by May 2, 2022 at AHDAPayments@gmail.com. No category changes will be accepted on the day of competition.
9. Dancers will compete in inverse order of entry. First to enter is last to dance.
10. Competitors must be on hand when their event is called, or they forfeit their right to dance in the event.
11. All competitors must remain in costume for award presentations.
12. Dancers must be dressed appropriately at all times.
13. Protests must be made in writing, signed and submitted to the Organiser by the end of the competition day and must be accompanied by a \$35.00 fee, refundable, if sustained.
14. Cash Awards for 16 years & Over premier classes: **1st \$40, 2nd \$35, 3rd \$30, 4th \$25, 5th \$20, 6th \$15**

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Our goal is to provide a safe, calm, inclusive and positive environment for all participants. We appreciate unexpected situations could arise on the day that may require action that is meant to protect our dancers, judges, volunteers and other participants.

This event is being held in compliance with all provincial health and safety orders, as well as facility requirements for Covid-19.

1. Public Health requirements will be continuously evaluated, and participants will be informed of the Covid-19 protocols prior to the event through social media and email.
2. In the absence of any Public Health Order mandates, the organizing committee for the AHDA Closed Alberta Provincial Championship and Open Competition strongly encourage participants to:
 - a. Wear a mask for your own protection and the protection of others (dancers continue to have a choice whether to wear a mask while competing)
 - b. Maintain physical distancing wherever possible
 - c. Frequent hand hygiene
 - d. Stay home if you feel sick
3. Upon registering for this event and immediately prior to the event, you agree to the requirements and recommendations of any National, Provincial and local Public health and other governmental authorities as well as any requirements from Edge School or Mount Royal University which may be in effect at the time of the event, as it pertains to the Covid-19 Coronavirus and to adopt all necessary measures to those effects.
4. Participants are required to agree to each of the following at the time of registration:
 - a. Good Health Declaration
 - b. Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability Relating to Coronavirus/Covid-19
 - c. ScotDance Canada Competition and Workshop Waiver Form
