## **COMPETITION RULES**

- 1. The Competition is governed by the rules & regulations of the Royal Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing and ScotDance Canada. All dancers must show a current RSOBHD Dancer Registration card to register.
- 2. Registration will be accepted online only. Payment for via PayPal or Credit Card. Late entries (after August 13, 2023) will be accepted until August 20, 2023 at regular fees plus \$25/dancer.
- 3. Entry Fees: Pre-premier & under 16/yrs / dance: \$7; Trophy Fling \$10; Premier 16 yrs & over: \$8; AHDA/SDCCS Surcharge / dancer: \$2; Online fee: \$3/entry.
- 4. All competitors must present a current RSOBHD card stamped for 2023. A fee of \$10 applies to those without cards and awards will be withheld.
- 5. Age as of September 3, 2023
- 6. The Competition Committee reserves the right to combine, split or delete classes at the close of entries.
- 7. The decision of the Judges will be final. No persons other than the Competition Committee shall communicate with the Judges.
- 8. Protests must be made in writing, signed, and given to the Competition Secretary along with a \$20 fee before the end of the competition. The fee is refundable if the protest is sustained.
- 9. Dancers will dance in reverse order of entry: Last to enter is first to dance. Competitors must be on hand when their event is called, or they forfeit their right to dance in the event.
- 10. Any change in status must be communicated to Kim Spence at spence.kim@hotmail.com by 6 PM (MDT) September 2, 2023. NO STATUS CHANGES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY OF THE COMPETITION.
- 11. To receive awards, dancers must be properly attired. i.e. complete costume including dance shoes. Competitors must use the change tents provided as changing in public areas including washrooms is prohibited.
- 12. There will be NO ENTRY FEE REFUNDS for any reason.
- 13. No trophies will be awarded for Primary dancers.
- 14. No parents will be permitted in the Line-up area except those of Primary dancers.
- 15. <u>Cash Awards for Premier 16 yrs & over</u>: **1st \$60, 2nd \$50, 3rd \$40, 4th \$30, 5th \$20, 6th \$20.** <u>Restricted Premier 16 yrs & over</u>: **1st \$50, 2nd \$40, 3rd \$30, 4th \$20, 5th \$10, 6th \$10.**
- 16. Opening Ceremony Recreational Massed Fling (4-step) at 1:00pm. Please report to the front of the ATCO Stage at 12:45 pm. All dancers in any Highland Dance outfit are encouraged to participate at no charge. Please take part if you can, as this is part of our pageantry of the day, enjoyed very much by the spectators.

#### **SPECIAL NOTES - RESTRICTED PREMIER RULES**

- This competition will offer Premier and Restricted Premier events according to the rules and regulations of the RSOBHD and ScotDance Canada.
- A Restricted Premier dancer is defined as one who has not won an overall trophy in a Premier or Restricted Premier class for two (2) years preceding September 3, 2023.
- ScotDance Canada defines an OVERALL TROPHY win for Restricted Premier purposes as, "the dancer with the highest total
  number of points having competed in more than one (1) individual dance in a Premier competition age group that has 6 or
  more competitors, thus the name High Aggregate Trophy." Winners of special dances such as a Special Hornpipe or Special
  Jig, Best Dressed or Choreography event DO NOT qualify as an overall trophy win. A Championship and Pre-Championship
  are both considered a Premier event.
- Dancers who meet the requirements for the Restricted Premier class must choose either Restricted Premier or Premier for the competition on September 3, 2023, but not both (i.e. dancers may not compete in Premier and Restricted Premier on the same day).

#### COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Our goal is to provide a safe, calm, inclusive and positive environment for all

participants. We appreciate unexpected situations could arise on the day that may require action that is meant to protect our dancers, judges, volunteers and other participants. This event is being held in

compliance with all provincial health and safety orders, as well as facility requirements for Covid-19.

1. Public Health requirements will be continuously evaluated, and participants will be informed of the

Covid-19 protocols prior to the event through social media and email.

2. In the absence of any Public Health Order mandates, the organizing committee for the Canmore Highland Games strongly encourages participants to:

- a choice whether to wear a mask while competing)
- b. Maintain physical distancing wherever possible
- c. Frequent hand hygiene
- d. Stay home if you feel sick

authorities as well as any requirements from the town of Canmore which may be in effect at the time of the event, as it
