### **Competition Rules and Regulations:**

1. All dancing events are governed by the rules and regulations of the Royal Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing (RSOBHD) and ScotDance Canada.
2. This event may be cancelled at any time up to, and including on or during the date of competition, dependent upon public health concerns.
3. The decision of the judge(s) is final.
4. Dancers will compete in reverse order of entry. First to enter is last to dance.
5. Age is as of 12.01am on competition date.
6. Entry fee must accompany entry.
7. Late entries will NOT be accepted.
8. Refunds are at discretion of Organizers policy. Where admittance to event is refused based upon good health declaration, fees will be refunded (excepting an administration fee of \$3.00 per family).
9. All competitors must present current RSOBHD registration card prior to receiving awards. A \$10 fee will be charged for failure to present the card.
10. Protests must be made in writing, signed and submitted to the Organiser by the end of the competition day and must be accompanied by a \$35.00 fee, refundable, if sustained.
11. The Organiser reserves the right to combine or split classes.
12. Competitors must be on hand when their event is called or forfeit entry in that dance.
13. All competitors must remain in costume for award presentations.
14. Dancers must be dressed appropriately at all times.
15. Dancers are required to fill in for the Strathspey and Reel, if required, based on their number of entry.
16. Prizes:
  - Half the number of dancers dancing, to a maximum of six placings.
  - The RSOBHD scoring system will be used for aggregate awards: 137, 91, 71, 53, 37,23.
  - No aggregate awards will be presented for Primary
  - Premier 16 & Over Prizes: 1st- \$25, 2nd- \$20, 3rd- \$15, 4th- \$10, 5th- \$10, 6th- \$10
17. Dancers and parents must respect the ScotDance Canada Risk Management Guidelines, local health authority directives, and RSOBHD Code of Ethics.
18. Danny Matheson Memorial Trophy is awarded to the RHDA Premier dancer of the day with the highest aggregate points over all dances (except special dances). Age groups must have a minimum of 6 competitors on the day of competition in order to be eligible for an overall trophy. As per RSOBHD rules, if there are less than 6 competitors in any individual dance then points gained in that dance will not be included in the total aggregate points for the overall award.
19. Joanne Sinclair Memorial Trophy is awarded to the youngest Beginner class with the highest aggregate points over all dances (except special dances). Age groups must have a minimum of 6 competitors on the day of competition in order to be eligible for an overall trophy. As per RSOBHD rules, if there are less than 6 competitors in any individual dance then points gained in that dance will not be included in the total aggregate points for the overall award.
20. Small Group Choreography Rules - Open to all dancers (Pre-Premier and Premier):

- Each choreography must list the names of all teachers/studios.
  - Judges who have students participating in team/joint choreographies must abide by the 3 month teaching/judging rules as stipulated in the RSOBHD Constitution and Rules book.
  - Small Group is 3 to 7 dancers.
  - Choreography: must be Scottish or Celtic in appearance and style including costume and music
  - Time Limit: Maximum 3 Minutes

21. Performance Pas de Basques and Pas de Basques and Highcuts are for performance only. They are open to dancers under 7 years of age, who have not competed previously and are not competing in any of events 1 through 4. There is no charge for this event and no awards will be given.
